

1100 BOARD OF EDUCATION BY-LAWS**1170 SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS****A. Elections**

1. Qualified voters of the District elect directors to the Board of Education at regular school elections held on the first Tuesday of November in each odd-numbered year. At one biennial election, two directors are elected; at the other biennial election three directors are elected.
2. The County Clerk and Recorder is responsible for conducting the regular biennial school election. Candidates are nominated in the manner prescribed by law. In accordance with state law, candidates for school district directors shall file a candidate affidavit with the county clerk's office.
3. Any person registered as a District elector may vote. Voter qualifications are the same as those for voting in general elections, that is: (1) The person must be at least 18 years of age; (2) a citizen of the United States; (3) a resident of the State of Colorado for 30 days; (4) a resident of the election precinct for 30 days.
4. The Board has the option of conducting the election by mail ballot in accordance with state law and rules promulgated by the secretary of state.

B. Election Cancellation

If 25 days before the election, there is only one candidate for each position to be filled, the Board may cancel the election and by resolution declare the candidates elected, pursuant to state law.

C. Oath of Office

Each school board member within 15 days following the survey of votes is required to take an oath of office that he will faithfully perform the duties of office as required by law and will support the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of Colorado, and laws made pursuant thereto. Such oath shall be filed with the designated election official for the school district.
